

# The Constitution of the Kingdom of Sanctimonia

*We hold these truths to be sacred and undeniable that Sanctimonia is the country of holiness and justice. We citizens of Sanctimonia, in order to form a more powerful nation, provide for the defense forces, foster the welfare of the Church, the Creator, and the Royal Family, and secure the tranquilities of liberty for ourselves and our lineage, do establish this constitution for the Kingdom of Sanctimonia.*

## Article I

SECTION 1. *All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in the Monarch of Sanctimonia who shall be supreme of the legislature which will comprise only of his advisors.*

SECTION 2. *His majesty's advisors shall be known as the Royal Cabinet or Council and they shall have the power to do whatever his highness allows them to do, anyone who becomes a cabinet member must be appointed by the King.*

SECTION 3. *The King shall have the power to raise taxes, create laws, regulate commerce, regulate the militia, establish the national religion, establish the national language, and establish the national budget, and any legislative power not specified herein.*

## Article II

SECTION 1. *All executive powers shall be vested in the Monarch of Sanctimonia. The Monarch shall serve for life and also be the first born child of the previous Monarch.*

SECTION 2. *The Monarch shall be the commander in chief of the Army and Navy of Sanctimonia, and when he calls them to action they must obey due to his divine right.*

SECTION 3. *The Monarch is Head of State and Head of Government.*

SECTION 3. *He shall try his best to follow the national religion's rules, but is supreme over it.*

## Article III

SECTION 1. *All judicial powers shall be vested in the Monarch of Sanctimonia, and he shall have the power to declare what is fair and not, though the National Church shall have the religious authority.*

SECTION 2. *The religion of Sanctimonia is a pagan one around 2,000 years before the Common Era.*

SECTION 3. *The Monarch shall be the lord of the temples and churches, but the Pope will moderate those affairs.*
